

Installation guide Removable Pool Fencing

Installation guide & Planning Guide



Measure the barrier according to your pool. Line up the posts and mark the holes.



Drill the hole with 16 mm drill bit. Vacuum the dust from the hole and insert the post into the lock in deck feature.



Insert the first post in the plastic sleeve. Tension the lower stripe and mark the next post hole. Drill the second hole and insert the next post in place. Follow same steps for all the other posts.



Drill the hole of the 2-nd section of the barrier 6 cm apart from the next post mark. Insert the plastic sleeve and the rod. Attach the security latch and follow the usual steps. Round side of the post must be placed on the outside, the latch comes inside.



If needed loosen the screw of the last post and install it taking certain precautions. Pull the net taut, screw the upper part, then the lower.



Faster the bearings with dowels (not included). The gate lock and latch height can be adjusted so that it fits correctly together. Unscrew the bottom piece on the locking mechanism. Adjust the height until the gate aligns with the latch. Screw in place and your gate is set!

Planning your Pool Fence

The safest pool fence is a complete surround and what most people do is follow the shape of the deck surrounding the inground pool.

However, depending on how your patio and pool are laid out, you may not need to completely surround the pool. For narrow areas, you can “split the garden/terrace”, and run a secondary fence across from side fence to side fence. Here’s an example;



In other cases, you can use two sides of the property fence, to connect to two new sides created with our removable pool safety fence.



Straight or Curved? A straight pool fence is easier and cheaper to install than one that curves in and out.

To reduce the fence cost, you may want to sacrifice some internal deck space, but be sure to have enough space to be able to walk around the entire pool, and a place for seating or lounging. We recommend a minimum of 1 linear metre from the edge of the pool to ensure adequate space for manoeuvre.

Be careful that your fence line is not near raised walls, planter beds, trees, stumps or any other climbable objects - anything that could be used by a child to climb over the fence.

When you have a plan, lay rope or use chalk to **mark the outline** of the safety fence. If you buy the self closing gate, decide where this will be located. **Draw a Layout** on paper – it's a good idea for visualization and also for review, on installation day.

Measure! Once you have your fence plan formalized, it's time to carefully measure the total length of your pool safety fence. **Our pool fence** sections are available in 1m -15m lengths. Determine how many sections you will need with careful measurements.



Fence sections can be trimmed to fit any partial measurement. When installed, there will be a gap between lengths of approximately 1 inch. The optional pool fence safety gate Gate shown left, is 1035mm wide.

Height of fence is 1220 mm

Height of gate is 1235 mm
